October is here, and it's Operation Christmas Child shoebox time! Even in a pandemic, God has a plan for these shoeboxes and our church family will be doing even more this year.

We are honored to be the collection site for Shelby, Henry, Spencer and Anderson Counties during national collection week, November 16-23, 2020.

There Are Multiple Ways That You Can Help

- 1. Pack a shoebox or several! Our goal is 350. Bring them to the church by November 15 when they will be prayed over in the service.
- 2. Volunteer to help us collect the boxes during collection week.
- 3. Build a shoebox online through Samaritan's Purse. It is \$25 per box and they will pack the shoeboxes for you. Our church goal for this is 25 boxes. These shoeboxes may go into hard to reach areas around the world.
- 4. Purchase items through our Amazon wish list. These items will be used to pack shoeboxes.
- 5. Be watching on our church Facebook group for ideas and items to include in your shoeboxes.

A word from your pastor....

My beloved church family,

COVID19 has challenged the world like nothing else in our lifetimes. Wars have been more catastrophic but their effects have been limited geographically, whereas this pandemic has affected the whole world to a great extent. Travel, education, and social interaction have all been severely modified to offer safety to the extent possible. Likewise, how we worship and minister have been affected as a church. With pastoral love in my heart, I have to confess that I have missed much of our church family through this ordeal. There is a reason the Bible says, "not forsaking our own assembling together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another; and all the more, as you see the day drawing near." [Heb 10:25] Some have returned to worship and Bible study, at least incrementally. Our policy has been and continues to be consistent. We will provide hygiene supplies at the entrances and encourage social distancing. Masks are recommended but not required. Whenever possible, we have hosted outdoor events in order to maximize safety while still encouraging fellowship and dialogue.

However, there is a portion of the church family who, for a variety of reasons, feel the need for heightened caution. The elderly, those with ongoing health concerns, and those who are care-takers for the vulnerable simply have not been able to connect except with the benefit of the internet. While it has been a useful tool, coming together as a body is such a vital part of church function. Those without the internet have been all too detached through no fault of

their own. The Apostle Paul once said in 1 Corinthians 9:22-23 "To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak; I have become all things to all men, that I may by all means save some. And I do all things for the sake of the gospel, that I may become a fellow partaker of it." My goal as a pastor is to minister to as many as possible as creatively as possible. As



a result, as an expression of pastoral love for all the body, I want to offer a trial format for return to Wednesday Night Bible Study for some members. We are not ready to resume meals. This will be a MASK ONLY time, socially distanced in the sanctuary. We will come together in that part of the building with the highest levels of caution as a means to reach out to those with the greatest need for caution. Other programming may be in progress in the other parts of the complex, but that sector will be available to those who want to come utilizing these elevated precautions. We will begin a seven week study of selected psalms on October 21, 2020. Our previously announced policy will remain in place for all other events and gatherings. We simply want to be as inclusive as possible to as many people as possible. For now, we adapt in light of the pandemic; but we remain one body of believers united around the cross for the glory of the Lord. Someday, soon I hope, we can move forward without all these distractions. For now, the priority of the Kingdom supersedes the inconveniences of the moment. In His Grip, Bro. Maurice


New Offices for Shelby Baptist Association
