TEMPORARY Worship Protocol Nov. 22 - Dec. 13



Even in the midst of a pandemic, worship for the people of God is absolutely essential. The church leadership team (listed below) arrived at the following consensus after much

prayer and discussion.

- We will continue to offer worship In-person and live streaming via the internet Nov. 22-Dec. 13, 2020.
- To maintain the possibility of worship in these times of increasing vulnerability and out of love for our congregation and the community, masks must be mandatorily worn over mouth and nose for those not on the platform throughout the worship service.
- This is a TEMPORARY measure Nov 22-Dec. 13.
- If local conditions change, it could have to be reevaluated.
- The leadership team below will revisit this matter in early December for protocols which will be in place after December 13, 2020.
- Bible Study will return to live-streaming only for the next four weeks. No activities in the building will occur other than finishing Operation Christmas Child responsibilities with COVID19 protocols in place.
- The Wednesday Night mask-only Bible study will continue as planned, but other activities in the building will be postponed for this four-week period.
- Church staff will be encouraged to work from home whenever possible.

While not the preference of anyone, maintaining worship of the body of Christ is paramount. The entire group longs for the day when the full Family of Faith can worship side by side with no sense of fear.

The leadership team includes the Ministry Team (R. Maurice Hollingsworth, Chad Lynn, and Chad Montgomery), the Deacon Officers (Andy Donahou, Sam Chandler, and Jerry Murphy), the Trustees (Fielding Ballard, Wayne Anderson, Sarahbeth Farabee, Ralph Evitts; Barry Marston was ill and unable to attend) and the Moderator (Jene Hedden).
