My Beloved Church Family,

In January, Shelbyville First Baptist Church will celebrate 200 years of continuous ministry here in Kentucky. Former pastors will return to lead in worship and we will look back. Some might ask, "Why? What's the big deal? Who cares about ancient history with respect to the church?"

Taking time to remember is important. Let me refer you to a time in which God specifically exhorted his people to remember His mighty work. In Joshua 4:5-7 we see God's instructions via Joshua, "Joshua said to them, 'Cross again to the ark of the LORD your God into the middle of the Jordan, and each of you take up a stone on his shoulder, according to the number of the tribes of the sons of Israel. Let this be a sign among you, so that when your children ask later, saying, "What do these stones mean to you?" then you shall say to them, "Because the waters of the Jordan were cut off before the ark

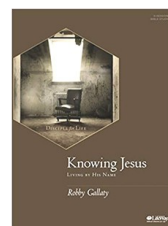
Adult Studies Beginning February 6

Following the conclusion of the Revelation 1:3 study

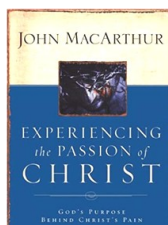
Overcomer – You were not made to live in disappointment, disillusionment, and defeat; God has given you the tools to live a life defined not by your trials but by your victories. In his new book, **Overcomer**, David Jeremiah offers his insights on one of the most quoted but least understood passages of the Bible: the apostle Paul's admonition to the Ephesians to take up the whole armor of God (Ephesians 6:10-18). This study will be taught by Dr. R. Maurice Hollingsworth.



Knowing Jesus – Early Christian tradition suggests that John's exclusive purpose for writing his Gospel was to proclaim Jesus as the Christ, the Son of God. He wanted his readers to know Jesus—from His words, from the words of others, and from His miracles. This small group study begins with an examination of the miracles recorded in the Gospel of John. It then takes you into the "I am" statements—what Jesus said about Himself. And the last two sessions focus on witnesses who affirmed who Jesus was and is. *Knowing Jesus* will help you grow in your faith, excel in good works, and know Jesus more intimately. This Course will be taught by Brad & Renee Callahan.



Experiencing the Passion of Christ – John MacArthur responds to questions about the nature of the Passion of Christ with a workbook that answers those deep, personal, and sincere questions. So many people know *about* Jesus, but they don't really understand *why* Jesus had to suffer and die.



Experiencing the Passion of Christ will give you a front-row seat as Christ's life unfolds. You will be placed on the scene, confronted up close with the painful events of the cross, but you will also see the majestic glory found in "the rest of the story." This course will be taught by Larry Davis.

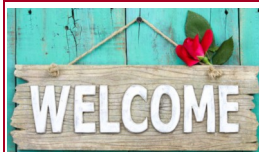
